We are on the A393 Redruth – Falmouth road, close to the Kennall Vale Nature reserve, a picturesque river valley containing the remains of Kennall Vale Gunpowder Works. Kennall Vale School opened in new, purpose built premises in 1993 and, since then, has been extended and completely refurbished. The school has 5 classrooms, and at present 132 pupils on roll organised into mixed-age classes.

Our school is more than just a place of learning; it is a home away from home where every child is valued and encouraged to reach their full potential. Year 3 and Year 4 reside in Morgawr Class with Zennor Class being the place for more Year 4 pupils and Year 5. Year 6 children are the stars of our Bedruthan Class where they finish their time at Kennall Vale.
